How it all began

Shortly after the end of World War II, Adolf Würth decided to set up a wholesaling business for screws and bolts, which opened for business on 16 July 1945. It was the beginning of a success story.

A 100-square-meter room in an outbuilding of the castle mill in Künzelsau served as the first company office. The vehicle fleet: a hand wagon and a hand truck. For larger transports, Adolf Würth borrowed an ox cart. With that cart, they covered the 17 kilometers to the L. & C. Arnold factory for screws and bolts in Ernsbach to buy screws and bolts.

Back in the small family shop, the screws were counted, weighed, and packed on a large table in the warehouse. Back then, Reinhold Würth always helped. But his favorite job was accompanying his father to customers. On these trips, he discovered two great passions of his: selling and traveling.

Global market leader

After his father's death in 1954, Reinhold Würth, initially supported by his Mother Alma, continued on to turn the company into the global market leader in the development, production, and sale of assembly and fastening materials. Over eighty years, his lifetime achievements have made the company what it is today.

88,000 employees and more than 400 companies in 80 countries form part of the Würth Group. The product range of the Würth Line comprises one million products for more than four million customers in the skilled trades and industry worldwide.


Joy in innovation

Prof. Reinhold Würth's life is inextricably linked with the history of his family business. And that is precisely why so many things bear his signature: the corporate culture, the social and cultural commitment of the company and the charitable Würth Foundation, the partnership with customers, the joy in innovation. Prof. Reinhold Würth achieved something in his life that he can look back on full of gratitude after 90 years.

The Stuttgart-based entrepreneur Rudi Häußler remembers the beginnings of the Würth Group particularly well. After all, he was the one who sold Adolf Würth his first typewriter (more on that in the text on the right).

A decades-old friendship

Senator h. c. Rudi Häußler, An anecdote about his extraordinary friend Prof. Reinhold Würth

The 90th birthday of my friend Reinhold Würth gives me the opportunity to look back on what has been achieved and share the one or the other experience I have had with him. I am very proud of our partnership and friendship and I do not want to miss any of my encounters with Reinhold Würth.

Speaking of encounters: It was in 1953 that I first sought to contact the company Adolf Würth to establish a business relationship. I came across the company due to its very positive media coverage. Even back then, the company's spotless reputation preceded it. Unannounced, I made my way to Künzelsau.


When I drove into the company's yard, Adolf Würth and his son Reinhold, who had just turned 18 years old, were loading screws into his car—an old pre-war DKW. I was only 25 years old myself and my question "Good day! Do you have a minute? I would like to present my company Häußler & Steinhilber, we sell office supplies," was met with a "Can't you see that this is a bad time!? Anyway, I'm looking for typewriters. If you can get

any for us, stay. Or come back when you can offer us the typewriters we need." He did not have to tell me twice and I answered with an eager "Yes!"

After the war, it was extremely difficult to obtain a working typewriter. But I wanted to deliver and used my contacts. I was sure I would find a typewriter on the market. And I succeeded! To my surprise, I was even able to offer two typewriters and my hope that Adolf and Reinhold Würth would purchase them came true. Seven days after my first visit to Künzelsau, I was proud to deliver the typewriters. Both were very satisfied. This rightly developed into a trusting business relationship and later turned into a unique friendship.

Time and again, we realized that we shared the same values. Thanks to our love for art and culture, we were able to build on our friendship over more than 30 years. Since then, Prof. Reinhold Würth has been the main supporter of the foundation Stiftung Semperoper in Dresden, which I founded 33 years ago.

Reinhold Würth is a person I could always rely on.
For me, he is many things all at once: an extremely successful entrepreneur, an exemplary sponsor of the arts, a passionate visionary, a strategic thinker, a model family man, and a friend and person that has remained grounded through all these years. I am looking forward to what will hopefully be many more encounters with him and his wife Carmen and wish them both the best of health.





The last of his kind

His corporate culture is unique, his life's work unprecedented: Prof. Dr. h. c. mult. Reinhold Würth, Honorary Chairman of the Supervisory Board of the Würth Group, has set standards in many fields in the more than seven decades of his professional life.

The boss is always the boss. This is a saying you hear often at Würth, and for once, it is a saying that Prof. Reinhold Würth has not coined himself. "Even at the age of 90, he is the soul of the company," said Robert Friedmann, Chairman of the Central Management Board of the Würth Group.

Prof. Reinhold Würth turned the screw business he had taken over after his father's early death more than 70 years ago into a globally operating group with more than 400 companies, 20 billion euros in sales and 88,000 employees. On the other hand, this company is deeply rooted in the rural Hohenlohe region and maintains a culture that is fundamentally different from DAX corporations of the same size. "He is the spiritus rector of the company," said Robert Friedmann, while adding "He does, however, not tire from saying that he would never have made it without all his employees."

Gratitude. Modesty. Honesty. You cannot prescribe such values; you have to live them—and talk about them. Prof. Reinhold Würth does both in his own way. Nowadays, he speaks quieter, softer than he used to. But when he says something, the room falls silent. Time and again, he denounces arrogance that he strives to keep away from the company. This is one of his most important concerns. Although it does not always look like it to the outside world, internally, he still is a down-to-earth character.

Values as a compass

The early years had been rocky. Prof. Würth likes to say that his greatest luck was his father taking him out of school early, which gave him the opportunity to work five more years with his father before he had to continue on alone. At the time, they laid the foundations for what Würth still stands for. Values as a compass even in troubled times. Even when he was young, he discovered his talent for sales, enjoyed packing the racks of the customers. Later on, he demanded this sense of business from his own sales reps. Profitable double-digit growth rates are and will remain his goal. In many ways, Prof. Reinhold Würth is the last of his kind. He survived a fighter-bomber attack in the Kocher valley as a child during World War II, joined the company at the age of 14 and took over responsibility for the small screw business in 1954 at just 19. He was part of the post-war generation, profited from the decades of the German economic miracle to achieve extraordinary growth, expanded abroad early on, and has kept the company on course with his innovative spirit to this day. An entrepreneur of the old school who always moved with the times and looked "behind the mountain and around the corner" as he himself formulated his recipe for success. What surprises others has long since been factored in at Würth.

Therefore, he confronts crises with the calm caution that he is known for: High liquidity reserves and a sound financial basis are not just annoying key figures for him, but fundamental corporate principles. When others get nervous, Prof. Reinhold Würth radiates calm. Sometimes, the perspective from above helped, too. From a business perspective, the plane was a

veritable time machine for him. But flying also evolved into a great passion: For almost 50 years, he piloted his planes himself.

Art connects

His second passion: art. An image by Emil Nolde purchased in 1972 marked the beginning of a collection that was later made public and part of the company.

In this field, too, Prof. Reinhold Würth trusted in his instincts. "He wants to look at works of art without bias first, and only then asks for the artist's name," said C. Sylvia Weber, who, after four decades, handed over responsibility for the now globally known Würth Collection to Maria Würth. He supported talents before their breakthroughs and acquired many works by established artists like Picasso or Edvard Munch before they gained in importance. The collection, which features more than 20,000 works of art, is now accessible to the public in several museums with free admission—a recurring theme in the Würth world. Today, his cultural heritage includes the orchestra Würth Philharmoniker.

More patient than before


Many of his decisions proved to be correct in the long run. "'Patience brings roses,' that is one of his typical comments," explained Rolf Bauer, who has been with Würth and his company since 1962, first as a member of the Central Management Board for a long time, then as a member of the Advisory Board, where he is still honorary member today. For decades, this patience may have applied to many things, but certainly not to Prof. Reinhold Würth's leniency when faced with poor performance or disappointing results. In recent years, however, he has also become a little more patient in this respect.

Stubbornness has been replaced by the patience of old age. The boss, who, until recently, still proclaimed "I am the stockholders' meeting," has passed the baton on to the next generation. He created room for his grandchildren: Benjamin succeeded him in the Supervisory Board of the Würth Group, Sebastian became Chairman of the Advisory Board of the Würth Group, while Maria devoted herself to the arts. In their positions, they now benefit from the advice of this mentally still alert 90-year-old. That his mind is still razor sharp can be seen in his stance against the German right-wing party AfD.

And then there's the actual source of happiness in his life: his wife Carmen, with whom he is enjoying his 69th year of marriage, and who knew how to handle him all these years—all his quirks, all his stubbornness, restlessness, and perfectionism. Together, they went through difficult times, including the mental disability of their son Markus resulting from a vaccination. This resulted in the establishment of Hotel-Restaurant Anne-Sophie, which was founded at the initiative of Carmen Würth, where people with and without disabilities work together.

Today, the couple enjoys the time they spend together, knowing how precious it truly is. In his speech on his 75th work anniversary on 1 October 2024, he thanked his dear wife with the words "Today, you are the heart of the family."

SWG is a part of the Würth Group and has been supplying Würth for almost 60 years. According to Prof. Reinhold Würth, Würth should not only sell screws, but—ideally—also produce them. This paved the way for the foundation of SWG.



The Würth Group passed the mark of one billion Deutschmarks in sales for the first time. Today, the Group generates annual sales of more than 20 billion euros and has nine billion euros in equity.

Prof. Reinhold and Carmen Würth established the charitable Würth Foundation, which promotes projects in the fields of education and science, social affairs and integration, art and culture. Its activities focus on the Heilbronn-Franconia region.

The Supervisory Board of the Würth Group, the highest governing body of the Würth Group, assembled for its inaugural meeting. Prof. Reinhold Würth took over as Chairman.

The new administration building with integrated Würth Museum was inaugurated in Gaisbach. It was the starting point for five company-owned museums and ten associated galleries aimed at making art accessible to everyone free of charge.

Initially supported by his mother Alma, 19-year-old Reinhold Würth took over the management of the two-man business, which at the time generated annual sales of EUR 80,000. Carmen Würth is his staunchest supporter: The couple is going through the 69th year of their marriage.

With the acquisition of the painting *Cloud Reflection in the Marsh* by Emil Nolde, Prof. Reinhold Würth laid the foundations for the Würth Collection. Today, the Würth Collection houses more than 20,000 works of art spanning approximately 500 years of art history.

Other trading and production companies, the Allied Companies, operate in related business areas, ranging from electrical wholesale and electronics to financial services.

With the increasing demands of our time and from customers, the product range was increasingly expanded and specialized. At Reinhold Würth Innovation Center CURIO, which was opened in 2022, innovative product and system solutions are developed in-house, so they can be launched on the market more quickly and better geared to specific customer requirements. Other fields of expertise in CURIO include logistics automation, computer vision, and applied robotics.

With passion for detail, Würth develops innovations and refines triedand-tested products. The fourth generation of the ASSY wood screw is already on the market.

Sometimes, it's the small things that make the difference. Perfecting the mundane: That is what the name Würth stands for.

A world-class art collection, a top-notch orchestra, plus 15 museums with free admission: Prof. Reinhold Würth is also a unique collector, his achievements in the field of culture are enormous.

"Dealing with the arts has always been a counterpoint to my professional activities. It has incredibly enriched my life, because it opened up the view into a completely different world," Prof. Würth said about his activities. More than 50 years ago, he acquired the first Nolde watercolor, which was followed by more than 20,000 paintings, graphics, and sculptures. Prof. Reinhold Würth cultivated and maintains close relations with artists such as Robert Jacobsen, Alfred Hrdlicka, Christo and Jeanne-Claude, Georg Baselitz or David Hockney. Today, his collection is a very personal one, of striking quality and diversity in which the expressive and the aesthetic are present everywhere.

"In my opinion, my grandfather never collected art to own it, but to share it," observed granddaughter and art historian Maria Würth, who is now in charge of the company's art activities. 
